STORIES OF INTERNAL RELOCATION


Alianys arrived at the Aldeais Infantis reception and integration center in Rio de Janeiro through the Institutional modality of the internal relocation strategy. In September, she was one of 10 women who participated in the professional course in hospitality, taught by the D11 movement who focuses in providing training for employability. The project, initially aimed at residents of the Rocinha community, also involved Venezuelan families, through a partnership between UNHCR, the Accor group, a multinational in the hotel sector, and D11. After completing the course and having her resume distributed to the hotel chain, Alianys was formally hired and began working as a housekeeper.

The Accor Group is a member of the <u>Companies with</u> <u>Refugees Forum</u> and has also promoted training for refugees and migrants interested in working in the hotel sector. The partnership with Accor has been ongoing since 2022 and, in July this year alone, 20 people were trained. Since the beginning of the project, 30 people of 8 different nationalities were hired.






In July, the 8th edition of Empowering Women Refugees project, an initiative of UNHCR, the UN Global Compact and UN Women, was kicked off in Boa Vista. By September, three classes were held and 53 Venezuelan women completed the Service and Sales course offered by SENAC. In total, 21 people were hired and 56 were relocated with job vacancies in various cities in Brazil.

Overview of the Interiorization Strategy from April 2018 to September 2023

The Federal Government's Interiorization strategy, implemented by Operação Acolhida, voluntarily relocates Venezuelan refugees and migrants from the states of Roraima and Amazonas to other cities in the country. 
